

WHAT IS EXPLORATORY STUDENT ADVISEMENT? (ESA)



Academic Structure



- Enroll in courses approved by Advisor
 - All changes must also be approved
- Attend mandatory workshops each semester
- Complete the UNIV 101: Saluki Success course
- Meet with your 1) Saluki Success Coach, 2) Tutor or Academic • Coach; 3) and Academic Advisor on a regular basis
- Honor SIU's Student Conduct Code
- Regular attendance and completion of coursework is required!

REQUIREMENTS FOR DECLARING YOUR MAJOR

- Be in **GOOD ACADEMIC STANDING = 2.0 GPA*** (on 4.0 scale) after two standard semesters in SSI
- Earn your SUCCESS CERTIFICATE, samples include:
 - 1. Attend at least **6 WORKSHOPS**.
 - 2. Participate in at least **1** COLLEGE SPOTLIGHT event related to your major or interest.
 - 3. Attend weekly **ACADEMIC COACHING SESSIONS**. Schedule with a Coach here.
 - 4. Complete at least **10** sessions at the **TUTORING CENTER** or **WRITING CENTER**.
 - 5. Participate in at least **1** ACCOUNTABILITY GROUP session (2 sessions = 1 workshop).

*Some special admission programs may have additional steps.

A MINIMUM OF **12 CREDITS** IS REQUIRED TO BE CONSIDERED **FULL TIME**.

Anything below 12 credits could affect Financial Aid, Scholarships and Housing eligibility.

NON-TRADITIONAL CREDIT OPPORTUNITIES

1. ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) TESTS

• Order scores to be sent through College Board.

2. DUAL CREDIT

• High School classes offered by a community college for college-level credit. Official college transcripts are required for credit.

3. INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB) CREDIT

• Must pass Standard Level (SL) and Higher Level (HL) exams with a minimum score of 4 and in some cases a 6 or 7.

4. COLLEGE LEVEL EXAMINATION PROGRAM (CLEP) TESTS

• College Level Examination Program (CLEP), select exams offered through College Board are eligible for college credit.







COLLEGE STUDENT BASICS

1	CHECK YOUR SIU EMAIL & SALUKINET	Daily! Learn how to skim and spot the most important ones. Especially from your advisor! You can find most things on Salukinet.
2	READ YOUR SYLLABI	Review the instructor's preferred contact methods. Read through all the policies. Pay special attention to attendance policies and academic dishonesty policies and consequences.
3	BE PREPARED FOR CLASS	Do you have the books you need? Other tools? There may be resources on campus to help. Are you mentally prepared to engage in class when you walk in the door?
4	GO TO CLASS	Have to miss due to illness or something else? Talk to your instructor. Find a buddy to share notes with if you have to miss.
5	BE ENGAGED	Ear buds out. Phones away unless asked to use it in class. Eye contact. Nod in agreement. A confused face is not the same as asking a question .
6	USE STUDENT DROP-IN HOURS	Don't be afraid of your teachers. They can be your best advocates. Building relationships with them could equal scholarship opportunities, recommendation letters, and internship and job leads.
7	LEARN HOW TO STUDY	Use Morris Library! Tutoring Center Writing Center Academic Coaches
8	COMMUNICATE	With Instructors, Saluki Success Coaches, Advisors, other support systems. Don't suffer in silence.
9	CHECK YOUR PROGRESS	D2L for course work. Degree Works for overall requirements. Ask your instructors.
10	CONSULT WITH YOUR ADVISOR	Every semester. And early whenever possible. Don't wait until the last minute.
11	KEEP AN EYE ON YOUR GPA!	Potential rewards and scholarship opportunities VS Potential Academic Probation or risk of not graduating. Don't let your GPA drop below a 2.0!


